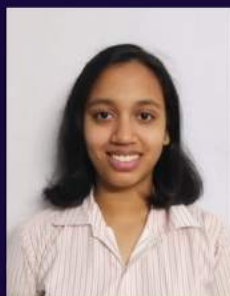

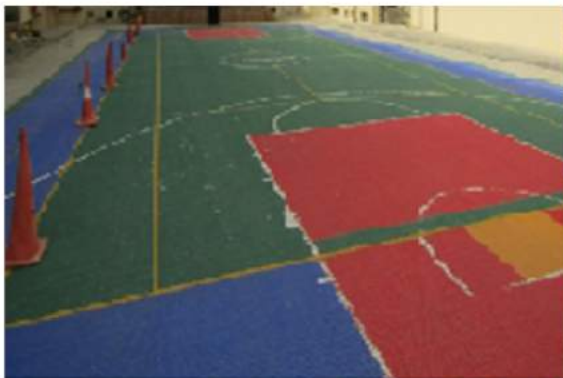

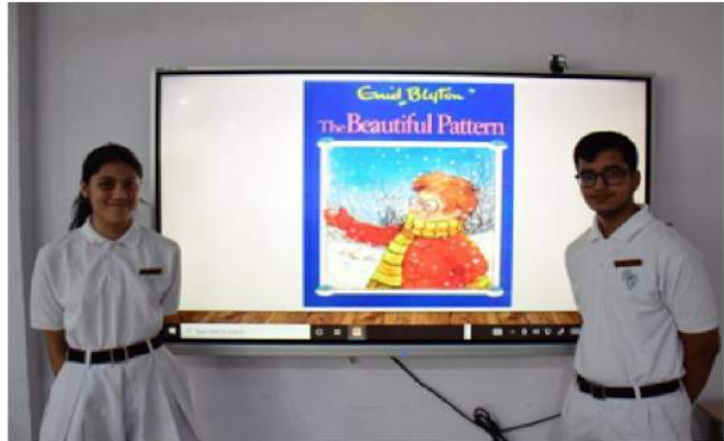


# CELEBRATIONS

### 1. CHOOSING YOUR ACADEMIC FIELD BY ZEEYAN, VII B

Choose your academic field wisely. The career choices you make in school can have an impact on the rest of your life and career! Are you currently in school and wondering what you should major in? Did you just graduate and still aren't sure what you want to do with your life? Or are you about to go to college and don't know how to select your academic field? Here are some helpful tips to help you figure out which academic field is right for you, whether that's business, science, education, or something else entirely!

#### What do you love?

There's probably a long-winded answer to that question, but you only need two words: I love writing. With that said, use those two words to make a list of everything you're interested in and would be glad to share with others. You can find your calling by taking an honest look at what excites you. And if you're still not sure, think about where your friends are and what they do for fun—is there anything common among all of them?

#### What are your strengths?

If you have a particular talent for writing, for example, then you might want to consider a career in journalism. If you're more of an expert in science and math, then perhaps pursue that as your field. Interests and hobbies are also good indicators of what type of education might suit you best.

#### What are you interested in?

If you can't decide what you want to study, start by figuring out what interests you. Ask yourself if there are any topics that have piqued your curiosity lately. Is there anything in history or science that has fascinated you recently? What about news stories or trending issues that keep popping up? Just because your passion isn't an official subject area doesn't mean it isn't worth exploring!

#### What will give you job security?

A lot of students look at their career options and determine what they want to do based on what they find exciting. While it's great to be passionate about your work, it's also important to consider factors like job security when choosing a career path. By thinking about a few key things, you can choose an academic field that will offer you a sustainable income for years to come. Here are some guidelines

### **Where will you get a great education?**

**As you start to narrow down your academic field, think about where you want to earn your degree. Even if you end up changing majors later, a top-rated school will provide a great education and be flexible enough for you to change your mind. Then, work on preparing your application in advance so that when applications open (and they will!), you can focus on building relationships with professors and getting great letters of recommendation.**

### **Can you get into the best school in that area?**

**It may sound cliché, but it's worth exploring if you want to get into an Ivy League college. If you're looking at more mainstream universities, look up each school and their GPA requirements. The better your GPA, the more likely you are to be accepted—and into a major program in that field. For example, if you are thinking about pursuing a career in finance or business, go to one of those schools with a great business program.**

### **Is there enough competition?**

**One factor that comes up a lot is how much competition there is for your field. If you decide to major in accounting, for example, it's likely that a large number of people are going after these jobs—so it's up to you to distinguish yourself from other potential hires. What makes you different? That's an important question to ask your own self. Think about what you have that other candidates don't and what makes you unique—in good ways and bad ones too!**

### **What would you be able to pay off with a degree in this field?**

**One way to pick your field of study is to look at what you could potentially earn after graduation. How will you pay off your student loans? What kind of salary would it take for you to pursue a career that you're passionate about? Think through these questions and write down some potential answers before narrowing down your list of potential majors. If money is an important factor in your decision, be sure to take a look at all of these numbers before making up your mind.**

### **Is there room for advancement in this field, or will everyone have the same job as yours?**

**Typically, academia is not known for a high degree of upward mobility—especially early on in your career. You'll likely have to take on extra courses and certifications to even be considered for a promotion. Additionally, many professors go their entire careers without even thinking about becoming a department chair or dean. So if you have dreams of quickly advancing through your field, it might be time to reconsider academia as an option.**

## **2. SAVING MARINE ANIMALS BY TARINI SINGH, VIII A**

**Saving marine life is a very important task because they are a major part of our ecosystem.**

**When I say the word 'fishing', what picture comes to your mind? You all must be thinking of a fisherman sitting near a lakeshore or sitting in his boat with his fishing rod taking out a few fish and putting the fish in a bucket. This is a pleasant picture, isn't it? But let me tell you this is not the case now; fishing has today become very commercial.**

**There are huge ships that put kilometres of long fishing nets in the ocean to capture millions of fish. These nets are often left/dumped in the ocean. They are consumed by animals like whales and other fishes and they die. Animals like turtles and many other organisms get trapped in these traps and also die.**

**Do you know why so many dolphins and sharks are killed because of these fishing activities? We don't eat dolphins and sharks, but still, they're killed because when the kilometres of long nets go into the oceans they bring up dolphins and sharks along with other fishes. Since there is no use for these animals, they are simply killed. Dolphins are also taken into the marine parks for different dolphin shows. No one asks these dolphins to perform in these marine parks and they are forced to leave their home and perform. This is called 'bycatch' and around 300,000 whales and dolphins are killed every year as bycatch by the fishing industry, making it the most prominent cause of death for these animals.**

**This is the depressing truth of today's fishing industry. The only solution to save those marine animals is to stop eating seafood. In nature, everything is interconnected. If we discontinue being non-vegetarians, primarily avoiding fish consumption, in effect it will trigger less supply resulting in minimum fish-catching and zero bycatch which would then help the preservation of marine life. Once marine life is decimated, it shall have a severe adverse effect on the entire ecosystem there is no other recourse, as it cannot be revived back. But the fishermen can find alternative means of livelihood.**

### **3. FACTS BY AIYANA AGRAWAL, III B**

It sounds like something out of a sci-fi novel, but British inventors John Foden and Yannick Read have come up with a bicycle that actually flies. The Xplore Air Paravelo is composed of a folding bicycle and a lightweight trailer that contains a biofuel-powered fan motor. The motor turns the fan, and with enough of a runway, it can reach up to 25 mph in the air and 4,000 feet in altitude.

For millions of people, the coffee break is important. But do you know the town of Stoughton, Wisconsin, hosts an annual Coffee Break Festival?
